

Illinois Cosmetology, Esthetics, Nail Technology License FAQ's

What type of education does the State of Illinois require to obtain your Cosmetology License, Esthetics License, or Nail Technology License?

Someone applying to become a licensed Cosmetologist, Esthetician, or Nail Technician must successfully graduate from an Illinois State licensed Cosmetology School by completing no less than 1500 clock hours of supervised education for Cosmetology, no less than 750 clock hours of supervised education for Esthetics, and no less than 350 clock hours of supervised education for Nail Technology.

Is there a State Exam required in order to obtain your Cosmetology License, Esthetics License, or Nail Technology License?

Yes, upon completion of your Cosmetology education you must complete and pass the Illinois Cosmetology State Board exam with a 75% or higher. This test is not administered at your Cosmetology School and does require a fee

Are there additional requirements in order to renew my license?

Yes, Licensed Cosmetologists, Estheticians, and/or Nail Technicians must take a minimum of 14 hours (Cosmetology), 10 hours (Esthetics), or 10 hours (Nail Technology) of continuing education classes every 2 years in order to renew their professional license and pay a bi-annual renewal fee.

Outside of the education requirements, what skills does it take to become a licensed Cosmetologist, Esthetician, and/or Nail Technician in the State of Illinois

Cosmetologists, Estheticians, and/or Nail Technicians should have a pleasant personality, be trustworthy and reliable, be active listeners, develop time management skills, be aware of others' reactions and how to respond to them, and be flexible with working long hours, weekends, or holidays.

What compensation can a successful graduate reasonably expect in the Cosmetology, Esthetics, or Nail Technology Field?

Compensation can vary greatly in the cosmetology, esthetics, or nail technology field. Due to the ever changing environment of the industry, full/part time work, commission structures of different salons, and the ability to market/sell oneself are all dependent on possible earning potential. Below is a list of median salary ranges for each field. Debutantes will not guarantee any individual will make a certain salary upon graduation.
